Managing Director, Carol Wolff states, "You couldn't write a better script or choose a finer setting! The synergy has become legendary." At season's end, they leave in pursuit of their professional dreams, but for many, an undeniable bond with the theatre and Grand Lake draws them back.

ELIZABETH (BETH) LANZA spent four summers with RMRT, her fondest memory being 2011's opening night in RMRT's brand new theatre in her dream role of Belle in *Beauty and the Beast*. She

recalls that in her first season, 2006, the idea of building a new theatre was "but a pipe dream."

"To see that dream grow, become a reality, and feel a part of it over those few years – we all felt ownership of our theatre, our town of Grand Lake. I will never forget that joy."

DYLAN PAUL, who recently opened on Broadway in *Cabaret*, spent three seasons at RMRT and recounts a "shattering" experience in 2005. In the midst of rehearsal for his role as the toothy-grinned Gaston in *Beauty and the Beast* he took, in his words, "a huge and cartoonish swig from my ceramic mug and quickly realized that I had shattered my front tooth."

Undeterred, Dylan went on to earn an MFA, recreated an archive of accents and dialects from around the world (dialectsarchive.com), worked at the Illinois Shakespeare Festival and as a resident troupe member of the American Shakespeare Festival in Virginia, and taught abroad as a Fulbright recipient.

Dylan has returned to RMRT to appear in a number of holiday shows. "As RMRT continues to build an enviable national reputation, I remember that the people here invested in me and I want to reciprocate and celebrate that."

Both Dylan Paul (*Cabaret*) and fellow RMRT alum, Andrew Cao (*Aladdin*), performed at the recent Tony Awards in New York City.

BEHIND THE SCENES

MICHAEL ROSEN is a veteran of eight years in the RMRT pit. And yes, this theatre has a real live pit with real live musicians! Should you hear a clarinet, flute, oboe or one of a dozen or more instruments, that's Michael. Since 2008, when not at RMRT, he has performed with many national tours and regional theaters.

"Why have I invested so many years in this theatre? I truly

KENT BARRETT, Production Manager and Set Designer, hires and supervises the entire technical staff and is RMRT's "resident middle man," coordinating the needs of the production team and directors. When the sound is just right, the Jesus Perez-designed costumes shine, and the exceptional sets are illuminated to perfection, thank Kent and all of his behind-the-scenes team!

Seven years into his RMRT tenure, Kent recalls his first year's impression. "The sense of community among the theatre company itself and with the town – I had never been around so many lovely, gracious and wonderful people all in one place."

Kent's career took him to regional theatres across the US and 10 countries. He soon realized that Grand Lake was where he wanted to be each summer, tailoring other opportunities around that.

"With the opening of the new theatre in 2011, RMRT began to invest in equipment, technology and personnel, and evolved into a major professional theatre. We now possess one of

the best sound systems in a three-state radius and one of the top projection systems in Colorado." He applauds Michael Quiero and Jeff Duke for creating an artistically nurturing environment that is "light-hearted and jovial," with flexibility in their artistic approach.

Many shows sell out, so don't miss any of them in RMRT's new, state-of-the-art theatre in the quaint mountain town of Grand Lake.








wallop! Directed by Jeff Duke, it is a powerful affirmation of the human spirit and a contemporary masterpiece. Rated PG.


